Please choose ONE option from the 3 below. You will need your novel and copy/notes to answer the questions.

Option 1: Formal Letter

Write a letter to the author, Siobhan Dowd, discussing your response to the novel. You should use the following 'Success Criteria Checklist' and the sentence starters to help you **(50 marks, approximately 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ pages)**:

Success Criteria Checklist - Tick each off as you write your letter and check again when you are proofreading your essay

- Correct layout, addresses in the correct place, date etc (you can make up the author's address).
- Begin with 'Dear Ms. Dowd'
- 5 paragraphs
- Introduce yourself (paragraph 1)
- Include 3 body paragraphs
- Paragraph 2 - Response 1 and discussion
- Paragraph 3 - Response 2 and discussion
- Paragraph 4 - Response 3 and discussion

- Paragraph 5 - Conclusion
- Use correct formal letter sign-off
- Check spelling, grammar and punctuation (check as you go, after each paragraph and review at the end using your proof reading wheel)

Sentence starters/ hints: We have given you lots of reasons/responses to the novel.

Useful sentences for your introduction (par 1)

- My name is X and I am a 1st year student in Curragh Post-Primary School

Useful sentence starters for paragraphs 2,3,4 (body paragraphs)

Possible response/reason for a body paragraph

- Joey's hunger strike really grabbed my attention from the outset, I wanted to know more about...

Possible response/reason for a body paragraph

- I found the revelation about Uncle Tally shocking because...

Option 2: Book Review

Write a book review on the novel, 'Bog Child', by answering the questions below. (50 marks, approx. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ - 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ pages) NB - REMEMBER THAT THIS IS A BOOK REVIEW, only use the questions as a guide, your piece should be structured as an essay with paragraphs like the one above, not as direct answers to questions.

1. What happened in the story/what was the story about?
2. Describe the protagonist
3. Describe two interesting moments in the book.
4. Describe the climax of the book (the turning point where the tension reaches its highest point).
5. How does the protagonist change throughout the novel?
6. Describe a moment that shocked you.
7. Was there anything interesting about the way it was written?
The language? The imagery? The point of view (1st person/third person/changing perspectives)
8. Was it a good novel? Give two reasons for your answer.
9. Would you recommend this book to others? Why?
10. Who would be a suitable audience (readers) for this book?
